

**MUSIC CLUB OF HOLLYWOOD FLORIDA
2023 COLLEGE GRANT INSTRUCTIONS GENERAL INFORMATION
FOR 2023 MOLLY GARRETT AND JUNE FOOSHEE GRANTS**

COLLEGIATE GRANTS ELIGIBILITY:

1. The student must be a high school graduate prior to or during June of the year of application. A statement from the high school authority identifying the student as a member of that year's graduating class and stating that the applicant is graduating may be required. If the applicant has received a high school diploma or equivalent prior to the year of application, the applicant must furnish the copy or original of such and it must be verifiable by the appropriate school authority.
2. A document from the music school the student plans to attend stating that the student has been accepted or is already enrolled in their music school is required with the application.
3. College students who receive grants from the Music Club of Hollywood Florida must be enrolled as a music major in a full-time program at an accredited college or university.
4. Missing or incomplete applications may be disqualified and/or ineligible for an audition has been accepted or is already enrolled in their music school is required with the application.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND INSTRUCTIONS:

1. The grant recipient shall be chosen on the basis of merit, musical ability, character and need following an audition before the scholarship committee.
2. The college must be accredited but is of the student's choosing. It is not a requirement that the student attends a Florida school.
3. The payment of the grant shall be to the student upon receipt of proof of college enrollment.
4. The Scholarship Committee's decision, based on the judges' input and scores will be final.
5. The awards are funded annually by the Music Club of Hollywood Florida. The number and dollar value of the awards may vary from year to year.
6. Grant Applicant must be an American citizen.
7. Applicants must be a current resident of South Florida. Must mention if you have competed in the National Federation of Music Club under Music Club of Hollywood Florida.
8. Late or incomplete applications are grounds for disqualification.

9. Upon receipt of the scholarship award from the Music Club of Hollywood Florida, the student will receive a one-year free membership in the club. In subsequent years, recipient students are encouraged to maintain their membership and will be responsible for annual dues of \$45.

10. The awards will be by check when the awardee has submitted a copy of acceptance from a college or proof of courses to be taken for the semester. In this instance, the student assumes responsibility for any tax issues that may arise or the Spring term.

11. Checks cannot be issued to the student until evidence of college acceptance and attendance as a music major is furnished.

12. The Music Club of Hollywood Florida reserves the right to use audio and video recordings of performances under our sponsorship for promotional purposes on our website and other media. We will ask the student permission for use of media that is made public on the Music Club of Hollywood's channel on YouTube, other video sharing sites such as Facebook on Music Club of Hollywood page and others that are searchable on the internet.

13. Failure to comply with any of the eligibility or application requirements may be cause for disqualification.

14. The 2023 grant will be a one-time award. The student must apply and audition in future college years.

PLEASE NOTE:

There will be live or in-person auditions on Sunday, April 23, 2023, at the Anne Kolb Nature Center, Hollywood, Florida for those applicants who are accepted to participate. Applicants can perform solo or a cappella. A piano will be furnished.

We accept all styles of music-classical, jazz, Broadway, folk, etc. Video links or files should be sent to MCOHscholarship2@gmail.com or mailed as DVD or CD to Howard Rosen 1410 N 35 Ave. Hollywood, FL 33021 by February 27, 2023 along with exact titles and composers of selections that would be played at the live audition. You must provide your own accompanist.
